Dear Friends.

'When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established' (Psalm 8:3)

As March arrives, I hope that it doesn't roar in like a lion, we've had enough of wind and storms. Rather I hope that we've had a spell of calm days and clear nights to enjoy the Dark Skies Festival. It is such a blessing to live here in this part of the world and be able to go outside and observe the heavens in all their glory. They have been rather special lately with a rare alignment of planets visible during January and February, if you've been blessed enough to be outside on a clear night.

I last wrote to you as the old year drew to a close and we were still celebrating with the wise men who observed Jesus' star at its rising and were guided to meet with the infant and recognise all that he is. The idiom 'all the stars were aligned' is generally taken to mean that all that needs to be in place for a fortunate event to occur has been lined up. It feels a little bit like that here in Upper Ryedale. Things are lining up beautifully so that we can move forward into the future with hope. I've been blessed by joining with you in worship and in our church meetings and I am deeply grateful for the quiet and committed folk who look after our churches and each other with such loving care.

We will be advertising soon for a new priest to come and live and minister alongside us here. Please pray that the right person will feel the call, apply and that we will discern who that is. They will certainly be coming to a place where exciting things are happening.

Rievaulx Methodist Church have organised their wonderful Pancake Evening again on Tuesday 4th March at Rievaulx Village Hall. There are extended serving hours from 5 to 8pm and all proceeds are in aid of Yorkshire Cancer Research. It helps us all to get focused and ready for Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday 5th March with a service of Holy Communion with Imposition of Ashes at All Saints' Helmsley at 7pm

We have our Lent Prayer Walk on 9th March which is based on the Lord's Prayer. It will be led by Bishop Barry Hill (who some of you met at Christmas when he celebrated with you at St Mary's, Scawton). Along with him will be Archdeacon Amanda Bloor, who has taken services here too and many other friends and supporters including the Reverend Andy Lindley the Ryedale

Methodist Circuit Superintendent, our own Reverend Ian Robinson and pathfinder Joyce Garbutt. A lovely opportunity to walk alongside wise and caring people, enjoying some prayer, worship, and friendship. If walking isn't your thing you can join in for coffee and cake at Old Byland, lunch at Cold Kirby, and a celebration service at Rievaulx Abbey. See the details elsewhere in the newsletter.

You are all warmly invited to join in with our Lent course, it follows on from the walk as it is based on Archbishop Stephen Cottrell's book 'Praying by Heart: The Lord's Prayer for Everyone'. It begins on Friday 14 March at 11.30am in All Saints' Helmsley and concludes with a soup lunch beginning at 12.15pm. It will run for 5 weeks, you don't need to buy the book to join in unless you would like to and you don't need to attend every week, come as you can.

Interest grows in the Saint Aelred Pilgrim Trail as it continues to draw local and national attention in social and print media. So much so that we are considering the possibility of transforming St Michael's Cold Kirby into a resource for walkers, pilgrims, visitors and our communities too. George Gyte will be sharing more information as it becomes available.

Please see our list of Holy Week and Easter Services across Helmsley and Upper Ryedale, the Easter Service in the parish is at All Saints' Hawnby this year at 10am on Sunday 20th April. To draw this newsletter to a close where it began, as April comes to an end, you might have opportunity to see the oldest meteor shower still visible today, the Lyrid Meteor Shower, first recorded in 687BCE. It nears its peak on Easter Day and is most visible just before dawn so come to the sunrise service at 5.45am. See what I mean about the stars aligning. I do pray that you have a blessed Lent and Easter with ample opportunity to enjoy all the wonders of creation.

Saint Aelred's Pilgrim Trail: Update from George Gyte I hope that you will join us on Sunday 9 March 2025, and take part in Bishop Barry's and Archdeacon Amanda's SAPT Lent Walk. It is our Spring project, and we are looking forward to it being an enjoyable outing amongst friends. Bishop Barry's Christmas Morning Service at Scawton went down extremely well and was enjoyed by a full congregation. This is another opportunity to meet our new Bishop with, amongst other things, a passion for roller skating! Local artists such as Trudy Sanderson with her exciting SAPT textile installations, Daisy Barnes with her stunning mandalas, Katie Freeman's beautiful scenic oil paintings, and Sue Wressell's lovely frames of textile artwork are on display at exhibitions and installations in the churches along the route. These presentations and displays showcasing our local artistic talent are well worth visiting, so don't miss this opportunity. This is a Gathering Walk, so it is up to you where you want to join, and how much walking you wish to do. If you walk from Old Byland it will be 8 miles to Rievaulx, if from Scawton it will be 6, and from Cold Kirby 4.5. As with our Launch Walk last September, a number of people will join us at Rievaulx to participate in the Abbey Service led by Bishop Barry and afterwards enjoy English Heritage's hospitality and be treated to hot drinks and refreshments in the Abbey Café where we will enjoy Steven Davies' splendid sausage rolls and delicious vegetarian and meat pasties.

The arrangements for Sunday 9 March are as follows:

10am: Coffee and cakes in the Church of All Saints, Old Byland where Bishop Barry will lead short prayers.

10.30am: Commence the Gathering Lent Walk.

11.30am: Prayers in the Church of Saint Mary, Scawton.

11.45am: Leave Scawton

12.45pm: Arrive for prayers at the closed Church of Saint Michael, Cold Kirby followed by soup and roll and your own packed lunch in Cold Kirby Village Hall opposite the church.

1.45pm: Leave Cold Kirby

- 3.30pm: Arrive Rievaulx Methodist Church for tea and biscuits followed by prayers in the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin 4pm: Procession commences led with Cross and Banner to Rievaulx Abbey Nave for a short service led by Bishop Barry accompanied by the Bilsdale Silver Band.
- 4.30pm: Hot drinks, pasties, and sausage/vegetarian rolls in the Abbey Café.






